Puppet Play: The Pharisee and the Tax Collector

What You'll Need:

- The coloring page of the Pharisee and the tax collector (print it out!)
- Crayons, markers, or colored pencils
- Scissors (with help from an adult)
- Glue or tape
- A stick for each puppet (popsicle stick, tongue depressor, straw, or chopstick)

What To Do:

- 1. Color the puppets Color the Pharisee and tax collector in your favorite bright colors.
- 2. Cut them out carefully.
- 3. Attach a stick to the back of each puppet with tape or glue.
- 4. Play out the story!
- 5. The Pharisee puppet says proud words like: "I am so good. I always follow the rules!"
- 6. The tax collector puppet says humble words like: "God, please forgive me. I need your help."
- 7. Act out how Jesus wants us to be humble, like the tax collector.
- 8. Show your puppets to your family and tell them what you learned!
